Subject: California International Academies/TVLC Web Domain Follow-Up

Mr. Zukoski and the TVLC Board:

Last night at the board meeting I commented and asked about California International Academies (CIA) and what their involvement with TVLC is. Unfortunately, the answer to that question was very short and really left the question lingering in my mind. I believe it is in the best interest of the corporation to notify the board of any involvement with this organization either past or current. The web domain registration with TVLC being listed as the owner and point of contact is extremely troublesome and the suggestion by one board member last night that it was perhaps a former board member that needs to change their login information was laughable. If the board members are not willing to take information like this seriously and conduct a full inquiry in order to ensure there is no involvement with CIA, I have to wonder why you would bother even sitting on the board which is charged with providing oversight and protecting the public assets.

Attached you will find the records showing these two web domain registrations from the ICANN website. I have also copied leadership from LVJUSD as I believe that they are entitled to know about this if they do not already.

I want to assure you that I am not one of these community members that is "out to close down these schools" as was suggested of many people that have criticized TVLC recently. The very fact that a board member brushed off the serious concerns of parents as being from people who just want to close the school was utterly offensive. I am a parent that is proud to send my children to a school as fabulous as LVCS and hope to continue to for many years to come. However, I like many others have serious concerns about the TVLC organization and it's potential questionable ties to private organizations. I urge you to be forthcoming with any information regarding this. I also urge the board to take action to investigate these domain registrations as quickly as possible.
