Subject: Has construction been approved for the parking lot?

Dr. Lysko and TVLC Board Members,

Pictures would assert yes, construction has started. In the town hall last night the discussion was that the construction required permits. Also, the discussion indicated that there were yet to be finalized agreements on which contractor was to be selected and used. Is TVLC or maybe the "co-tenant" going to just defy that there is a need for a board approval? Is the land under which the parking lot is to be built still TVLC owned land?

At the TVLC town hall, a very clear message was delivered by parents in attendance. There is no desire for the parking lot to be built until the financial situation and situations around NOV's is well understood and controlled. TVLC is under the specter of multiple NOV's which include questions of operations. Why would ANY capital project be undertaken on TVLC owned or leased properties whether paid for by TVLC or not.

While any reasonable person will agree that the need for the parking lot serves the safety of children, the need for the parking lot has not proved to be either beneficial for nor detracting to the viability of TVLC.

If TVLC or the intended "co-tenant" is going to just force this construction, at what point does it show that TVLC actually has the best interest of the vocal and interested community of parents, teachers and volunteers in mind? At what point will TVLC and the current administration be considered to be in conflict with its constituents and then subject to legal action by those constituents? Not what point will parents feel that legal injunction against TVLC will be the best course of action to stop or slow this situation?

Are the business and financial interests of someone other than TVLC driving decisions? Seems like pressure is being applied and TVLC is capitulating...external pressure.

TVLC is running a risk of losing its families and their support. Is TVLC still a viable model when it, its board and its administration cannot make decision except under duress? Is it viable in the face of a rising voice of unhappy parents...some of whom are already signed up for other schools?

Step back from the construction. Step back from lease agreements. Re-evaluate. Do not let external pressures control our destiny. Do not tie our success to the success of a "co-tenant".

You are losing our trust...what little is left. That is the last thing you want to have happen.
