Dear TVLC board and Dr. Lysko,

I urge you to renegotiate the lease on the building at 3090 Independence. LVCP cannot afford the building with the lease as it is negotiated now. I urge you to get a vetted and unbiased third party to renegotiate with extremely close attention paid by everyone on the board. There is no excuse for members to be absent from meetings when there are decisions to be made at this critical time.

Do not approve the parking lot construction or any other major expenses until your constituents have regained your trust. If you think one ounce of trust has been regained for the corporation or board as a whole, you're wrong. The only thing that has happened so far is the start of communication.

If the permit is acquired, construction needs to wait for Board approval. The Board governs, not the corporation. You - the board - are in control. I urge you not to pass any motion that allows spending of any kind until the community has the trust we need to move forward.

I urge you to resolve all NOV's and NOCs and renegotiate all leases that are not in the best interest of the schools. I urge you to start discussions with the district (LVJUSD) about facilities. It's extremely surprising to me that Dr. Lysko has not been in regular twice-weekly contact with the district. But it's not too late. The district is our ally and a hope for us.

Some of the students reliant on this corporation are sick to their stomachs about potentially having to change schools. Please think about that as you read leases, consider permits, and review budgets. Think first about the students and the teachers. This budget is for them and it's in your hands. That is a tremendous responsibility and again, it's yours.

I understand you are under great pressure. I can empathize. But if things were done properly in the past, you wouldn't be under this pressure, so ask the hard questions of the people who put you there. In the meantime as you're waiting for answers, I urge you not to spend, build, or sign without careful consideration and complete transparency.

Do the right thing and slow down, renegotiate, and seek unbiased counsel on every motion put in front of you for decision - and make those decisions considering the "students first".
